

3- Dimensional card

INSTRUCTION ON HOW TO MAKE THE CARD

It's a pleasure to be a part of the Christmas Card Competition - 2020 and I've chosen to participate in the 3D Card Category.
As Christmas is being celebrated with joy and jingles with winter in the month of December, the card was constructed considering the same in the theme of Winter.
I enjoy sharing the instruction on how to make this handmade card. All the steps and images of all the elements in the card is given below.

Materials

Card is A₄ half fold size(portrait) that used thick papers and card. Added watercolor touch to the digital print images to get more vibrant and 3D look.

Method

The construction of this card comprises 5 steps as demonstrated below.

Step 1.

Print the brick effect & cut off the middle (A4 half fold size - portrait





Collect all the elements representing Christmas such as Christmas trees, Santa, snowman etc. and cut each of the elements separately. Used watercolour to get more vibrant on each of the elements.




Step 2.

- Cut all the pictures to make 3D winter scenery within the dimension of 4' x 4'. Make a 4' x 4' square frame and stack each with double tape (2mm thickness) to get the 3D effect.







- Make half A₄ size frame and place the 3D from on it. (Blue marked areas to touch the front cover)



Step 3.


Cut the lines and fold from the marked position as depicted below. (Original image is given in the last page) and paste on a blue board to get more colours and visible.





Step 4.

Fix the light strip to the 3D frame as depicted below and connect to the circuit(below) that on the base card to light-up the winter scenery when opening the card.






Step 5.


Assemble all the components to get the finalized card as demonstrated below.

- a. Cover the 3D frame with an acrylic sheet and place the brick effect sheet on it.
- b. Then, arrange all the elements to make it more colourful.
- c. Add 1 mm thick tape on some pictures to increase the 3D effect.
- d. Paste the element we've created at step 3 on top of it.
- e. Finally, cover all the surfaces with the brick effect and the card is ready!




